DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word “dog” is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, they display no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Dogs with bandages, sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Dogs that are both deaf and blind are able to participate so long as the handler is in control of the dog at all times, the dog can complete the requirements of the class, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

CLASS ELIGIBILITY – NOVICE A & B

NOVICE A Classes are open to dogs who have not completed any title for that particular element, who have not completed a comparable title with another organization, and whose handlers are neither Scent Work judges, nor have ever worked as professional detection dog handlers.

NOVICE B Classes are open to all dogs.

HANDLING MORE THAN ONE DOG

Handlers may not handle more than one dog in each class (WITH THE EXCEPTION OF HANDLER DISCRIMINATION CLASSES when offered). Multiple dogs for the same owner may be entered in the same class, provided they are run by different handlers.

ENTRY FEES

An entry is defined as a single run by a single dog in a single class.
Entry fees include a \$4.50 per run AKC recording fee.

No entries will be accepted by phone, email or fax. Express mail entries must **not** be marked “signature required” therefore allowing them to be left at the secretary’s address. Inquiries may be directed to Cyndi Kepner at ckrotteez@comcast.net. No entry shall be made or accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

ILLEGIBLE ENTRIES will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. The Club will add a \$35.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check.

MOVE-UPS prior to the trial must be received in writing by the Trial Secretary no later than Tuesday, **September 15, 2026 at 10:00 am**. Emails are preferred, NO VERBALS, or Texts.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION

Nita-Nee Kennel Club will place a maximum of 12 entries on the wait list. All entries, including wait list entries, must be received by the Secretary by closing, September 7, 2026 at 10:00 AM EST. The wait list will be maintained through Tuesday, **September 15, 2026 at 10:00 AM EST**. If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait listed entry, a refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry. Payment/checks received for a wait listed entry that does not move off the wait list in to the trial will be shredded by the trial secretary.

REFUNDS

NO FEE WILL BE REFUNDED if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.

BITCHES IN SEASON will be awarded a refund, less \$11.00/run processing fee. Notification in writing (including a veterinarian's certificate) must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial. Notifications in writing can be emailed to the TS if not attending the trial but must still be received 30 minutes prior to the start of the first class.

INJURED DOGS OR HANDLERS will be awarded a refund less \$11.00/run with a veterinary / physician's certificate. Physician's Certificate should be mailed or emailed to the trial secretary prior to trial, or personally presented to trial secretary prior to the commencing of judging.

TRIAL SECRETARY will not be held responsible for entries or changes not received at all or not received by any deadline. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to follow up on any correspondence with the Trial Secretary before any deadline date. If you do not get an email reply from the Trial Secretary, it most likely means she did not get your correspondence and you need to try to contact her again using an alternative form of communication.

RIBBONS, AWARDS AND PRIZES

Placement ribbons will be awarded in each class as follows:

A **New Title ribbon** is available to dog and handler teams finishing a title.

RESULTS AND RIBBONS

Results will be posted at the trial site and on the Trial Secretary web site after the trial.

Ribbons are self-service inside the building.

All exhibitors should obtain a copy of the Regulations for Scent Work Trials by downloading them from the American Kennel Club website.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to ensure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.

STAGING AREA, HANDLERS' BRIEFING AND WARM UP AREA

STAGING AREA: The staging area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include warm-up area, waiting area, gate boards for checks-ins, Trial Secretary scoring area and posting of running order and results.

HANDLERS BRIEFING: The handlers briefing will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handlers' Briefing the judge will explain if there is an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides, and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handlers' Briefing.

WARM-UP AREA: The warm-up area will have one labelled container per target odor being used in the trial on that day and will be placed in the designated warm-up area. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Each team should limit their warm-up to two minutes or less so that others may be able to use the warm-up area as well.

SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class. Searches may be indoors, on matted, carpeted, concrete or tiled surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces. Search Area Sizes will be as defined in the AKC Scent Work regulations.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

TRIAL SITE: It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

POSSESSION OF ODORS AND TRAINING: Chapter 5, Section 35 of the Scent Work Regulations state, "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area."

SPECTATORS: Spectators are encouraged. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide.

CRATING SPACE: Exhibitors will work from their cars. Nita-Nee Kennel Club is not responsible for lost or damaged items left at the show site.

CLEAN-UP: Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Disposal sites will be available on the show grounds.

FOOD: No food available on site.

WORKERS: Worker Sign up will be available at the trial for each judge's schedule of classes. Please volunteer if you are able. We can't run a trial without volunteers.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY BEHAVIOR AND LIABILITY: The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Nita-Nee Kennel Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. Nita-Nee Kennel Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Nita-Nee Kennel Club or any official thereof.

COLLARS, LEASHES AND HARNESSSES: During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH AT ALL TIMES. Retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

RINGSIDE: Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system, or stewards or runners, for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN: Exhibitors must check-in for each class each day they are entered.

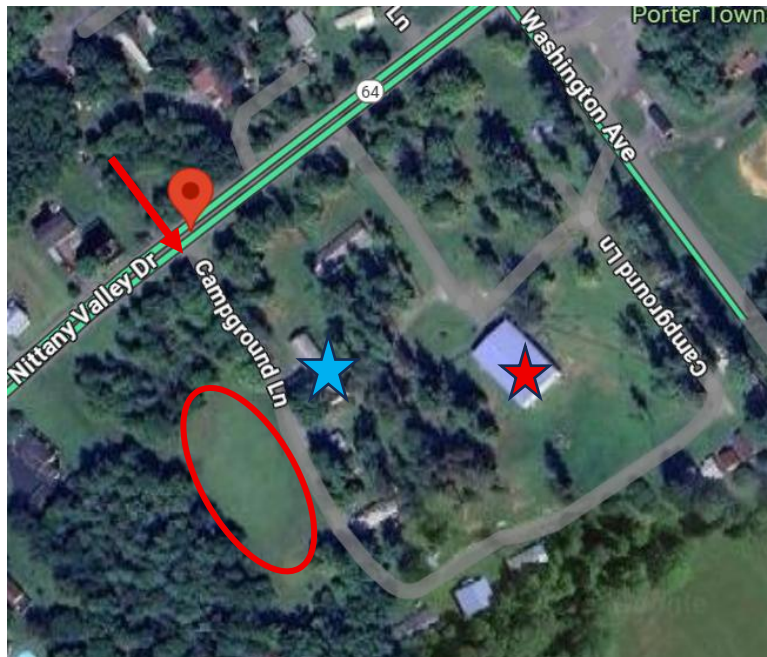

US-220 South from Williamsport – Take US-220 S, Take exit 107 for PA-477 toward Salona, Turn right onto PA-477 N (436 feet), Take any lane to turn left onto PA-64 S/Nittany Valley Dr., turn left onto Campground Lane.

I-99 North from Altoona – Take I-99 N/US-220 N to PA-26 N in Spring Township. Take exit 81 from I-9 N/US-220 N, Drive to PA-64N in Lamar (13.2m), Turn right onto Campground Ln.

I-80 East from Clearfield – Follow I-80 E to PA-64/Nittany Valley Dr. in Porter Township. Take exit 173 from I-80 E toward Lamar, Turn right onto PA-64 S /Nittany Valley Dr., Turn right onto PA-64 S/ Nittany Valley Dr., Turn left onto Campground Lane. This route will pass through the construction near the Bellefonte exit.

US-322 West from Lewistown – Follow US-322 W to take Old Rte 322 in Potter Township. Exit from US-322 W, Turn left onto Old Rte 322, Follow PA-144 N to PA-64 N in Lamar (23.2 m), turn right onto Campground Lane.
